# THE PROBLEM

Owls, foxes, bobcats, and other predators keep ecosystems in balance. But when they **eat poisoned rodents** (easy targets in their sluggish state), **predators become sick and often die**. Second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides (SGARs) are the culprit, **poisoning thousands** of these animals in New Hampshire each year.

Rodenticide is *everywhere* — hidden in nondescript black boxes and fake rocks that are endlessly refilled.



Widely deployed by pest control companies, **bait stations have poisoned** the food chain, **causing wild animals to suffer slow, painful deaths** from internal bleeding.

# SAFE RODENT CONTROL

## 1 KEEP 'EM OUT

- Seal cracks in walls, roofs, and around pipes.
- Plug holes with copper mesh or steel wool.
- Cut foliage away from the house.



## 2 CUT OFF FOOD

No food = No rodents

- Keep trash sealed.
- Store pet food securely.
- Clean up bird seed.
- Pick up dog poop – it attracts rodents!



## 3 LET NATURE HELP

Invite owls, hawks, and other natural rodent controllers by installing owl nesting boxes or perches.



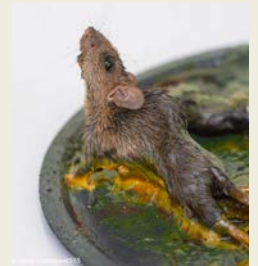
## 4 LIMIT NUMBERS

- Try repellents such as Mouse Magic or Nature's Defense.
- Use single or multi-animal live traps.
- Keep the population small by using fertility control, such as Evolve or ContraPest.



## 5 NO GLUE TRAPS!

Glue traps are so cruel they're banned in many countries! Trapped animals can suffer for days — some even chew off limbs trying to escape.



## 6 CALL AN EXPERT

Don't have time to handle it yourself? Call a wildlife control professional who uses humane methods and never poison. **List on back.**

**You may not want them in your house, but mice and small rodents are vital to the balance of nature!**
